Psalm 63

O God, you are my God; earnestly I seek you; my soul thirsts for you; my flesh faints for you, as in a dry and weary land where there is no water. ² So I have looked upon you in the sanctuary, beholding your power and glory. ³ Because your steadfast love is better than life, my lips will praise you. ⁴ So I will bless you as long as I live; in your name I will lift up my hands. ⁵ My soul will be satisfied as with fat and rich food, and my mouth will praise you with joyful lips, ⁶ when I remember you upon my bed, and meditate on you in the watches of the night; ⁷ for you have been my help, and in the shadow of your wings I will sing for joy. ⁸ My soul clings to you; your right hand upholds me. 9 But those who seek to destroy my shall go down into the depths of the earth; ¹⁰ they shall be given over to the power of the sword; they shall be a portion for jackals. ¹¹ But the king shall rejoice in God; all who swear by him shall exult, for the mouths of liars will be stopped.

This is a rough time of year. It is cold and dreary. It is a dark and desolate place. Not too unlike the wilderness that David was lost in when he wrote this Psalm. Well, maybe, it was not -4

degrees like was today. Maybe there was not any snow. Yet it was still barren wilderness and David felt lost.

I do not blame you at all for feeling lost or distressed during this time of year. We certainly have a lot of reasons to feel that way. But just like David, we have one place to turn and that is to the Lord.

I love his language. David recognizes that he is hot and thirsty. He is weary and in need of rest. In his need, David turns to the Lord. It is in the Lord that he is satisfied. That just like an empty stomach is satisfied after a Thanksgiving feast, David's soul is satisfied by the love and presence of God.

David knows that God is with him. He knows that God is leading him the empty wilderness. That God is leading him to the comfort of His eternal throne.

God is doing the same for you. Even as we navigate the bitter cold of winter, God is with you to satisfy you with the warmth of His presence. Even as you navigate illness and surgery, God is with you to satisfy you with His health and healing. Even as we navigate the utter despair of our sins, God is with you to satisfy you with bitter sufferings and death of His son, Jesus. God is with you.

Set your sights on God. Seek Him. Let your soul thirst for His love. In God alone, you will be satisfied.

Gods Hand in Celebrating My Parents 70th Wedding Anniversary

Big event for my family this month - the celebration of my parents 70th wedding anniversary! I thank God for the many blessings over those 70 years, and of course for continued blessings.

The preparation work for the celebration has caused me to reflect on God's work over those years. There have been many ups and downs, and God certainly works in mysterious ways.

As Christians, we have faith that He is present in ALL things, guiding the way with His perfect will. Sometimes His will is revealed to us. Other times, it may not be obvious, and we are sometimes left with "heaven questions". In Proverbs 3:5-6 we learn to Trust in the Lord with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding; in all ways submit to him, and he will make your paths straight'.

Growing up, my siblings and I knew very little about our parents' childhoods and ancestry, so we decided to explore. We quickly learned that we are lucky to be alive. Well not lucky, but fortunate by the grace of God.

We learned that my ancestors immigrated during the 1800s from Germany and Ireland (dad's side) and Poland and Slovakia (mom's side). These families likely experienced much poverty, political upheaval, and hunger during the post-Napolean era, and all ended up in Western Pennsylvania and West Virginia. Coincidence? I doubt it. My bet is on God's plan.

Both parents had very tough childhoods with their parents dying at early ages and them being placed with foster care, siblings, Catholic charities, State care facilities and the like. I always found it interesting that they spoke little of it and never complained. Not many people come out of such upbringings well. I thank God for watching over them, and I pray that He would help others in those types of situations as well.

And how did they meet? A bizarre encounter at a local hospital of all places. Mom worked in the cafeteria and dad did lawn care, both as teenagers, with mom living in a boarding house and dad at a Catholic charity. They had to individually support themselves. They dated for some time before getting married. My dad eventually enlisted in the Army, which ultimately took them to many locations across the United States and Germany.

Here they are 70 years later, having had 6 children, and blessed with 10 grandchildren and many great grandchildren. The journey continues one day at a time - who knows what else is in front of us all, before Jesus brings us all Home.

I read that on average, only 1 in 1000 marriages last 70 years. I'm not sure how that statistic was arrived at, but nonetheless, it's a rare event and one to be celebrated. So, here's what I take from all of this – live each day and be thankful for and put to good use the blessings that God has given us. Try to understand what you can, and don't be anxious in trying to figure everything out; God will reveal these things to us in His perfect way.


Another year, another Winter Conference; Same God doing new things. Praise Him for how He works! And thank you for your prayers and support of our ministry!


