Elder's Corner by Tom Harbaugh

It is that time of year I call the church doldrums. It is that time between Advent and the beginning of Lent. The church calls this time Epiphany. Epiphany celebrates God revealing himself to the world. We are just coming off the spiritual high of Christmas and birth of the savior and two months later we go into Lent, a time of repentance. which culminates in the death and resurrection of our savior (The highest of spiritual highs). During Epiphany we see scriptures that reveal Iesus as the son of God. I sometimes find it difficult to relate to the meaning of these scriptures during that short time between Christmas and Lent.

So, what do we do between those two spiritual highs? It is the dead of winter, dark, cold, blustery, just depressing. I find that you can get into a spiritual depression during this time. You don't feel like getting up, getting dressed and bundling up to go to church. I know there are Sunday mornings, in bed, snug and warm and I just don't want to get up. Sometimes those mornings you feel like God is just kind of not there.

Between Christmas day and the last Sunday before Ash Wednesday are 14 Gospel reading opportunities. This year 12 of those opportunities are readings from the Gospel of Luke. I find Luke to be an awesome set of recordings of what Jesus was doing, who he was talking to, and what he was saying. Historically, Luke was a said to be a physician and was Greek. He was educated and wrote well. In ad-

dition to the Gospel of Luke, he is credited for writing the Book of Acts.

I find reading Luke is proof God is there and Jesus is there right with us and through Luke we can hear and see what Iesus was like. Luke's interest in people is undeniable. Much of the material unique to Luke's gospel involves Jesus's interactions with individuals, many of them on the fringes of "acceptable" society—sinners, women, and children among them. Like Matthew and Mark, Luke recorded the incident of a woman coming to pour perfume on Jesus's feet. But Luke was the only gospel writer to point out the fact known to all present that she was an immoral woman (Luke 7:37).

Likewise, we find in Luke was the only one recoding the conversation between the robbers crucified alongside Jesus, one of them defending Jesus and receiving the promise of paradise. Luke's portrayal of Jesus reveals in our Lord a man come to minister and show compassion to all people, no matter their station in life.

Just as Matthew portrays Jesus as the King, and as Mark reveals Him as the Servant, Luke offers a unique perspective of Jesus as the Son of Man. This phrase, "Son of Man," was Jesus's favorite way to refer to Himself.

Most famous among the people unique to Luke's writings is the tax collector Zaccheus, a short man who had to climb a tree to see over the crowds as Iesus approached his town. Jesus ended up sharing a meal with Zaccheus at his house, much to the dismay and angst of the local religious leaders. When Zaccheus expressed his regret over his former way of life and vowed to make restitution, Jesus responded with what became the theme of Luke's gospel: "For the Son of Man has come to seek and to save that which was lost" (Luke 19:10). Luke portrayed Jesus as God's ideal Man, who offers salvation to all humanity—Jew and Gentile alike.

The richness of Luke's portrayal of Jesus has profound implications for our relationship with God today. Jesus walks through Luke's gospel illustrating His deep and abiding care for people, regardless of what they have done or their status in society.

Do you believe that God loves you no matter what you've done? The fact that the eternal Son of God condescended to lower Himself, take on human flesh, make Himself subject to human limitations, and seek out His people in bodily form shows us clearly how much God cares for us and, in turn, how we are to care for others.

So, don't let the doldrums wear you down. Take heart in hearing Luke's words during this time before Lent starts.

Evangelism/Hospitality & Fellowship Update

Jazz Warriors Big Band




