Dear Calvary,

Many of you have heard by now that Joy is retiring June 1st. I want to take this opportunity to tell you that I am very happy for her! She has truly served our church well for over a decade! I know that she has plans to travel, camp, and watch Pirate's baseball. I will be wishing her much joy and rest in this new season of her life! I pray that you will join me in showering her with our love!

Some of you may now be asking, "What is our plan for the church secretary position?" The council and I agree that we would like to hire a church secretary to work 27.5 hours per week. The hours for this position will be 8:45am – 2:15pm Monday through Friday. These hours ensure that the secretary of the church will be available for drop off and pick up during the CELC school year as well as perform the tasks needed by the congregation.

Why the change? Reducing the hours from 40 to 27.5 allows us to reduce some of the cost to the church. At 40 hours per week, we are required to provide short-long term disability insurance, retirement, and health care. At 27.5 hours per week, we are not required to provide health care. This change will provide savings to the church.

Now obviously a reduction in hours may result in a reduction of duties. We fully understand that. It is our belief that 27.5 hours per week is more than enough time to produce the weekly bulletins and assist the office staff as needed. Certainly, there may be some trial and error in figuring what else can and cannot be done during that time frame, but we are confident that with the right candidate we will have a highly efficient office.

Are you taking applications? As of April 1st, we are currently seeking resumes. If you are interested in becoming Calvary's next office secretary then please send your resume to me and I will forward it on to the council.

Elder's Corner by Bob Kemper

Behold, the Lamb of God, that takes away the sin of the world!

John 1:29

A remarkable royal procession made its way on Palm Sunday toward the capital city. The King did not appear very kingly as He sat there on His lowly mount. His servants had no shining armor, no gleaming swords. They were all poor fishermen who came from despised Galilee, as did the King. While His following was large it was in no way impressive: mostly women and children, loudly crying "Hosanna!"

Luke reports that the procession stops, and the King weeps! A king who weeps? Yes, the King of kings! He weeps because Jerusalem will be leveled, and He has so little time left to teach and to help His people. He rides on into the city; where specifically is He going? David's old royal fortress? No, because *His* royal fortress is outside the city wall, on a hill called Golgotha. As He rides along He can see the terrible throne which awaits Him. It is not a gold-adorned one such as the kings of Judah possessed long ago but a cross, the accursed tree that the Romans employed to execute common criminals.

We cannot fully understand the sufferings of Jesus, neither the anxiety that His soul experienced in Gethsemane nor His being forsaken by God the Father on the cross. As we read what Scripture tells us about the most terrible event that has ever happened on earth, let us recall John the Baptist's proclamation: "Behold!" The Israelites who had been bitten by poisonous snakes in the wilder-

ness had only to look up at the serpent of brass to be healed. They were not expected to understand this miracle of salvation, only to behold. So let us not become bewildered at the means of our salvation because we cannot understand it. We do not have to understand it, only behold! Behold the lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world! No Israelite died of the serpent bites provided he looked up at the serpent of brass. And no sinners will be lost as long as they look to the Lamb of God. This is true even though our sins are so foul in the eyes of God the Father that Iesus had to endure suffering beyond comprehension in order to redeem us.

Yet suffer he did – and we are redeemed and free! Jesus breaking the portal of death and hell on Easter is the greatest event in history. For we are all criminals under a sentence of death for our sins. However, as the apostle Paul states in Romans 4:25, Jesus Christ was "raised for our justification." God brought the body of Jesus out of the tomb to demonstrate that His beloved Son has paid the full price for our sin, and that as a result we are free. All charges against believers have been transferred to our Savior's account and paid in full by Him. Oh, the joy His resurrection brings to earth, and to heaven!!

How can we express the joy that Easter brings? One way is found in Colossians 3:17, where the apostle Paul writes: "Whatever you do, in word or deed, do everything in the name

of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through Him." There is to be no division between the sacred and the secular in what a Christian says or does. The Scriptures teach that our daily life and work are a service to God. Martin Luther's socalled Doctrine of Vocation emphasizes attitude. Luther maintains that it is equally as well-pleasing to God that we sweep the floor as it is that we preach the Gospel, given that both are done with the proper attitude of heart: to the glory of God, in love for Him, and for the welfare of others. So we are free to live life here fully. freely and joyfully serving our living God. As we celebrate His resurrection, may the blessings of Easter flow to everyone!!

Together In Mission


In February Joel and I were able to witness Jesus move during our annual Men's and Women's Retreats. While Joel stayed with our kids, we were able to hear that student from the men's retreat prayed to receive Christ over the weekend, praise God! This year the Women's Retreat was organized by our two staff women, Rachel and Marianna and the theme was "Sit, Stand, and Walk, a journey through the book of Ephesians".

I am pleased to report that even after 15 years, Ephesians continues to bring the reality of life with Christ so much hope and strength to me, as well as it did to the women that weekend.

The first session was a reminder on how to sit in the presence of the Lord and how our grace was "freely given us [by God] in the One he loves". We not only have redemption through Christ, but he chooses to "lavish us with the riches of God's grace". If we just choose him to sit next to, we will be given the gifts of his very Spirit (Ephesians 1:1-10). The second and third were characterized with stand and walk. The second, encompassing Ephesians 2:1-10, being "raised up and seated with Him in the heavenly realms" in the face of all of the challenges of this world.

"But God, in his great love for us..." becomes a battle cry for the hopeless and overwhelmed as we were reminded that we are established and wholly loved by a God

who delights in us. Finally, we were reminded that we are God's masterpieces, made for good works that God has already for us to take part in; the key understanding that we cannot enjoy those works if we are not sitting and standing in the truth of who we are in Christ. In addition, we all participated in intentional activities that brought struggles and damaging beliefs to the light, and were able to stand up for each other and smash those false beliefs to the ground (see photo). In the end, women left lifted up by the community and one woman even prayed to
