Elder's Corner

This message speaks of things science and nature cannot explain. It speaks to a world that teaches we exist because of natural processes and that, after our life ends, there is no more. In grand ways and continually before our eyes, God teaches us the very opposite.

God is not silent in showing us we are wonderfully designed and created. God says "Male and female, I created them" (Genesis 1:27). What evolutionary processes of incremental change can ever create "Male and Female"? How can nature and chance make two entities with parts that complement and fit and from which new life comes? Yet, God created our mothers and fathers and he created us. Tenderly and lovingly, he created us, in his image, planned before the foundations of this world, to be his children, to know his love and joy for us and our value.

We see wrong all around us, suffering, trouble of every kind, and we see the wrong within ourselves. God tells us there are consequences to all this sin. Jesus came to show us the heart and love of the Father, to tell us the Father's will and to show us the Father's actions in him. Jesus also came to die, to suffer and take on himself the consequences of our sin. In his dying and raising, he opened the door to Heaven for all who believe.

This saving message is not exclusive. It is for all people. Jesus wants all to believe in him and his promises and know his great love for us, and the forgiveness and freedom from sin bought with his life. He wants our life here to be lived with the hope and expectation of heaven. In this life God continually speaks to us as his dear children. He wants us to know he is always with us and caring for us. He encourages us to believe and trust in him in all things, always.

Who better to speak about Heaven than the one who came from Heaven. Jesus speaks about our deaths as merely a sleep (John 11:11). He speaks about Heaven as a paradise (Luke 23:43). There we will see his face and live with him forever.

This year at our annual Fall Retreat, we saw God's faithfulness in a few clear ways. One way was seeing the most students we've ever had attend! The last time we had over 100 students was in 2017 (115) and this year we saw 120 students assemble at the beautiful Camp Susque in Trout Run, PA. The entire weekend was full of highlights: community, team games, meaningful music and deep conversations to name a few. But I wanted to highlight one or two stories from the weekend.

One aspect of the Retreat with huge impact was our speaker, Shelby Abbott. Shelby has been on Cru staff for over 20 years and has served in many different leadership roles. He brings an easy humor and humility with him but not before exuding the love and good news of Jesus. He was able to speak expertly about walking with Jesus in light of the suffering and brokenness of the world (he touched on loneliness, anxiety and pain). He preached the gospel out of a place of vulnerability and hope as he practically was able to share how to walk with the Holy Spirit using the things God gives to us (scripture and Christian fellowship). A few students were able to share upon reflection how lonely they had felt and how this weekend was a prompt from God to reach out and become involved in healthy community on campus. One student even said he was tired of trying things like alcohol and parties to escape his loneliness and longed to be filled by the love of Christ and communities like this.

Another highlight at Fall Retreat was a seminar on dating led by Shelby. Shelby has written a book called "I am a Tool for Your Dating Life" and has done extensive research on the current culture of dating. He was able to start the seminar by explaining the Good News of Jesus clearly and concisely as a foundation and then touching on different aspects of dating from there. He was able to explain biblical standpoints pertaining to sex, communication and adulthood. Most of the students attended the seminar and anyone we interviewed after said they were personally encouraged and felt the Holy Spirit prompt them to make significant changes in their lives. Praise God!

Thank you so much for your prayers, partnership and financial support with us and our family in ministry. Events like the Fall Retreat simply would not happen without you! To God be the glory, forever and ever.
